Coach Warner has received her Bachelor of Fine Arts in Dance Education and Master of Education in Physical Education, Curriculum, and Instruction from Arizona State University. This has allowed for opportunity, over the years, to teach various forms of dance in the high school and dance studio setting for students of all ages.
