WHY BRENTWOOD CHRISTIAN SCHOOL?

BCS is a superior academic institution:

Six-time defending TAPPS Academic State Champion; On national standardized tests, our elementary students score above the 90%, our middle school students score above 86%, and our high school students score significantly above state and national college entrance exams; BCS has a wide range of Advanced Placement offerings; Students leave BCS with strong academic scholarships and are headed to the college of their choice. This past year, the Class of 2023 left BCS with \$2,245,320 in scholarships.

BCS extra and co-curricular offerings are exemplary:

BCS is the current holder of The Henderson Cup, awarded to the school with the highest aggregate rating of academics, arts and athletics. Simply put, by all merits, BCS is the best overall school.

Arts: The best Fine Arts facilities in central Texas; Drama, band, choir, and arts consistently place among the top schools in Texas, and are recognized locally and nationally; Wide range of musical, thespian, and art related offerings, both during and outside of school hours; BCS Band is the reigning state champion for TAPPS 4A.

Athletics: Competitive sports begin in the 5th grade; Wide range of fall, winter, and spring sports, as well as a supporting strength and conditioning program; Outstanding Lady Bellas dance team, including the Bitty Bellas program for our younger students. The BCS community comes enforce to the games and supports our Bears; The Bears have won state championships in multiple sports and placed as state runner-up in several others.

After School: On-site tutoring that is class-specific both during and after school; After school enrichment program for elementary students with rotating offerings per semester including options like piano, dance, math pentathlon and more; Robust and popular Extended Day program for elementary students allowing parents schedule flexibility and gives students opportunities for social and emotional growth.

BCS is a community:

Numerous athletics, art, and academic events offered and students are encouraged to be involved in multiple activities so they can determine the gifts they have and should grow; Parent opportunities to engage, learn, and be a part of our students' educational and extracurricular journey – parenting seminars, financial peace classes, movie nights, babysitting nights, and so much more; Parent networking that allows you to get to know other families and rely on each other for support. You will see exactly how the environment your child is learning in fosters his or her personal development.

Above all else BCS is committed to Christ:

Lessons are taught with a purposeful meaning and that is that God is the purpose and purveyor of all knowledge. All students attend chapel each week and pray to God each day; All students are required to treat each other and their teachers with respect and they are treated with respect in return; Expectations are known, consistent, and maintained – in a society that is losing its ability to maintain social discourse, BCS is emphasizing manners and discourse as expectations; Because BCS works in the light of Christ, everything we do is under an open and bright light, you will know what is happening with your child because you will be part of a community where bright lights are shined into every corner of what we do. We are proud of our daily offerings because we do all to the glory of God. As parents, you will be a part of your child's education through involvement and interactions with the students, teachers and administration. This is not only accepted, it is expected.

I have laid out many things for consideration, but in all honesty, I am only scratching the surface. BCS is a superior academic institution and provides an array of quality offerings that will give your child the ability to play, compete, perform, and grow. ADMINISTRATION

MISSION: Established in 1963, Brentwood Christian School is devoted to this mission: to lead students to love God and to nurture them in a Christ-centered academic environment that emphasizes excellence and inspires them to develop their God-given talents for lives of Christian leadership and service. Brentwood Christian School is a ministry of Brentwood Oaks Church of Christ.

STUDENTS: Brentwood Christian, a college preparatory school, currently enrolls 675 students, 263 in K4 through fifth grade, 158 in middle school, and 254 in high school. BCS welcomes students with a wide range of natural abilities from all religious, ethnic, and national origins who are seeking a solid Christian education. Minority enrollment is approximately 43%, with 13% Hispanic, 10% African-American, 7% Asian, and 13% biracial. Located in a wooded area in the northern part of the city, BCS draws approximately 50 percent of its students from Austin and 50 percent from surrounding towns.

FACULTY: Brentwood employs 48 full-time faculty, 36 full-time administration, and 25 part-time admin and staff. Ten teachers have been named Texas Christian Schools Association "Teacher of the Year," and three have been named Texas Association of Private and Parochial Schools "Fine Arts Teacher of the Year." The National Christian School Association has recognized the previous school president, elementary principal, retired elementary librarian, and a current teacher as "Educator of the Year." The former elementary librarian also was listed in "Who's Who in America" for her creation of the nationally recognized Children's Crown Award library program.

ACCREDITATION: Brentwood Christian School is accredited by the National Christian School Association (NCSA) as well as Cognia - AdvancEd, Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS) - the largest accrediting body in the world.

ACHIEVEMENT: Students in all grades Kindergarten through 12th grade take the MAP assessment (Measures of Academic Progress) three times per year to reveal a student's continuum of learning and growth trajectory. MAP assessments are computer adaptive, revealing which academic skills and concepts students have mastered and the areas in which they need additional instruction. The average SAT score for the 2023 BCS graduates was 638 on ERW and 615 on Math for a total of

1253, significantly above the local, state, and national averages of 978-1028. The average ACT score was 25.3, also significantly above the national average of 19.5 and state average of 19.3.

COLLEGE SCHOLARSHIP PROSPECTS: The majority of each graduating class goes directly on to college, earning an average of over \$2,000,000 in scholarships. Most graduates select a Christian university, the University of Texas at Austin, or Texas A&M University. The National Merit Scholarship Corporation has recognized 11 National Merit Scholars, one National Achievement Scholar, and 56 National Merit Commended Students.

CURRICULUM: All curriculum at BCS is written and taught from a consciously Christian perspective and meets or exceeds state and national standards. Elementary classes are selfcontained except for daily music and physical education, and weekly Spanish, computer, and library instruction. Band, art, choir, and sports begin in fifth grade, with additional electives being added in sixth through twelfth. High school students may choose the standard, advanced, or distinguished scholar curriculum. Textbooks, adopted on a rotating basis after faculty review, include both Christian and major publishers.

EXTRACURRICULAR: Students from fifth grade through high school compete in extracurricular athletics, including baseball, basketball, soccer, softball, track & field, cross country, football, and volleyball. Teams compete in the Capital Area Private and Parochial Schools in grades 5-8 and in the Texas Association of Private and Parochial Schools in high school. BCS band, choir, and drama groups rank high in statewide competitions. The student newspaper and yearbook have won numerous statewide recognitions. Student Council and Spiritual Life Committee play a significant role on campus. Honor clubs include National Honor Society, National Junior and Elementary Honor Society, and Thespians. Class retreats are traditions for grades 5, 6, 7, 9, and 12. Students work and raise funds for trips, including Washington D.C. in eighth grade and Europe for seniors.

PARENT INVOLVEMENT: BCS parents are noted for their enthusiastic involvement and support. The BCS Association of Parents, Teachers, and Friends, the Athletic Booster Club, and the Fine Arts Benefactors provide leadership in volunteer and fundraising activities.


